Dr. Roberts is a Board Certified orthodontic specialist with advanced training in Craniofacial Orthodontics. Her research and academic interests include dental and orthodontic strategies for obstructive sleep apnea, craniofacial development and evolutionary oral medicine, 3D orthognathic surgical planning and airway assessment, and advancements in cleft/craniofacial orthodontic treatment.

Dr. Chen is director of the Pediatric Sleep Center and attending physician at Seattle Children's Hospital and associate professor in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Washington School of Medicine. Nancy Addy, DDS, Diplomate, ABDSM
